In Tainui and Taranaki lore, it was Tāwhaki-Nui-a-Hema who climbed 'Te Toi Huarewa' - a sacred vine leading to Te Toi o Ngā Rangi (the heavens above) in pursuit of the three baskets of knowledge. Te Uru Tau, Te Uru Rangi, and Te Uru Matua. Before Tāwhaki made his ascent, he recited the following incantation to give him strength...

"Tāpiki-nuku, Tāpiki-waho, Tāpiki-te-aweawe o Tāwhaki."

Scope

In keeping with Ipukarea, our strategic plan, the investment in education for our hapū provides the pathway to empowerment, employment and mātauranga; putting you in charge of your own opportunities.

As kaitiaki of our legacy, we encourage our whānau members to seek knowledge across a range of skills that will support the development and advancement of our hapū.

Our education programme places emphasis on skills and subjects that our whānau will need for the future workforce, as well as skills that will enhance and preserve mātauranga Māori.

Raising the level of general education and training and increasing employment opportunities for all whānau members is our goal. So while some of our funding streams focus on specific skills and subjects, any application in-line with this goal will be considered, at all levels of learning.

The awarding of the Scholarships and Grants is at the discretion of the Ngāti Rārua Ātiawa Iwi Trust Board.

Timeframe

Applications for Tāpiki-Nuku and Tāpiki-Waho Grants (Primary and Secondary) will open in 2024. We will advertise opening and closing dates.

2024 dates:

Applications open 1 November 2023 – 15 January 2024. Decisions advised by 29 February 2024.

Submit only one application for the highest award you are eligible for.

If unsuccessful, your application will be automatically considered for another category.
