Scope

The aim of this global approach is to raise the level of general education and training of all members (not just a tertiary focus) that will provide a path to increase employment opportunities, whilst also focusing on the jobs of the future brought about by technological and other changes.

The Scholarships and Grants will be highly contested and the awarding of these is at the discretion of the NRAIT Board.
