Grants will be paid to primary (years 1–8) and secondary school age students to cover school donations, course fees, course costs, extracurricular learning activity (eg Kip McGrath). Primary Age - \$100 per annum Secondary Age - \$300 per annum	The grant is valued at \$750 for applicants studying full time for a full year, and up to \$375 for applicants studying part time or short courses. Merit Top Up Education Grant recipients are eligible for top ups as follows: Grades – on attaining a B- grade average or better, a Tertiary Grant recipient receives an additional top up of up to 50% of the initial grant awarded on verification of results. They will also qualify for a Tertiary Scholarship in the following year (if applicable). S.T.E.A.M. – if studying a S.T.E.A.M. subject, a top up of up to \$250 is provided, 1 per year. Te Reo – if studying a Te Reo subject, a top up of up to \$250 is provided, 1 per year. Trades – if studying a pre-trades course or apprenticeship, a top up of up to \$250 is provided, 1 per year.
