Travel Subsidy

NRAIT is once again providing a travel subsidy to encourage and assist whānau to attend the AGM on 28 April and the associated activities throughout the weekend.

If you're a registered NRAIT owner, live outside Te Tau Ihu and register and attend the AGM, you'll be eligible for a \$75 travel subsidy (one per adult). Whānau coming from outside Te Tau Ihu with tamariki aged under 17 who are registered with NRAIT will also be eligible for a per child travel subsidy of \$25. All subsidies are paid on receipt of application, and proof of eligibility if requested.
